Content	The practice of brahmacariya and the ideal of <i>muni</i> life, the monk and the graduated spiritual course: <i>Sīlasaṃvara</i> and <i>Pātimokkhasaṃvara</i> ; <i>Sikkhā</i> and <i>Sikkhā-pada</i> , ecclesiastical rules of the Vinaya Piṭaka and the recital of <i>pātimokkha</i> , the nature and objectives of the precepts included in the <i>Khandhakas</i> ; ecclesiastical offences and disputes; donation of monasteries and monastic residences; the structure and the administration of the monastery; evolution of monastic life and the attendant duties and responsibilities; monastic property, its use and management; divergent views as to the aim and objectives of the monastic organization; <i>khuddānukhuddaka</i> precepts and the problem of their interpretation.
